We're excited to provide you with another Summer Reading Adventure at the EPL! This year we're teaming up with the incredible Chatham Marconi Maritime Center to bring you a tremendous summer reading program: the 2023 "Find Your Voice" Summer Reading Adventure. Our July and August calendars are filled with programs that will have you exploring the many ways you can express yourselves and be creative! Our voices have power and we use them to share stories, communicate our thoughts, and make a difference in the world. Our voices can be heard through the sounds we make, the words we write, the art we create, the music we hear, the clothes we wear, the movements we perform, and the actions we take every day. There are so many ways to be creative, and this summer, you'll have the opportunity to explore different art forms and new creative outlets. Throughout the summer, our programs will ignite your imagination, provide you with summer reading inspiration, and give you the chance to share your unique voice with the world!

#### To make the most of your Summer Reading Adventure experience, we offer these helpful tips:

- Thanks to the generosity of our donors and support from the Friends of the Eldredge Public Library, all programs and activities are **free** to participants!
- All programs and events will be held at the Eldredge Public Library.
- Many events and activities require <u>pre-registration</u>. We offer online program registration; simply go to the Library website, <u>www.eldredgelibrary.org</u>, and look for the Calendar of Events. Registration may be completed from home or in Youth Services at the designated laptop.
- We are unable to register participants over the phone due to the busy activity in Youth Services each day.
- If you are registered for a program and are unable to attend, please contact Youth Services staff as early as possible so we may fill that coveted spot. Once we are full, a waiting list will be created. Filling the vacant spot is the responsibility of the Library staff; do not offer your spot to someone else. Unregistered family members or friends <u>must</u> receive prior approval to attend with a registered participant.
- Registration for July events is open; August event registration will open on Saturday, July 15th.
- <u>Please respect program times</u>. Our contracts with performers have fixed beginning and ending times, and restrictions on staff schedules dictate specific program time allotments. Please be courteous, as latecomers are a distraction for both the presenter and the audience. <u>This includes drop-in programs like</u> <u>Storytimes and Wee Read.</u>
- <u>Be mindful of age restrictions.</u> Not every program is meant for every age. Your child's grade level is the school grade your child will be <u>entering</u> in the fall. For example, if your child just completed 3rd grade and will be entering 4th grade in the fall, we consider them to be a 4th grader for summer reading programs.
- Please let us know before the program date if there are any important accommodations or considerations needed for a safe and positive experience for your child.
- Our programs may offer food and beverages. If your child has an allergy or food concern, please note this
  in the registration form. We will do our best to accommodate your child. For the safety of and respect for
  all patrons, we will not allow any registrant to bring their own refreshments. <u>No food or beverages</u> are
  allowed in the Library.
- The EPL may cancel a program if there are less than 5 registered participants.

#### Summer Tips Continued:

- While visiting Youth Services, children 8 years old and younger <u>must be accompanied by an adult</u> <u>caregiver at all times</u>. This is for the safety of the child. Due to the busy nature of the Youth Services area, staff are unavailable to watch unattended children. Additional policies are posted on the library website: www. eldredgelibrary.org.
- For your convenience, we have an infant changing table in the downstairs family restroom in the Library.
- Due to the small space and to ensure access for patrons in wheelchairs and using mobility devices, <u>no</u> <u>strollers are permitted in the Library</u>. This includes hallways, lobbies, stairwells, and alcoves. Please park strollers outside of the Library. We appreciate your assistance in ensuring access for all!
- Parking is always a challenge. Please be mindful of this to ensure prompt program attendance, and do not block the driveways, mailboxes, or yard entrances of our neighbors' homes and businesses!
- Cell phone use is not allowed in the Library except for photography purposes. This is not just a noise concern; it is a distraction that inhibits adult/child interaction and attention necessary for a safe, positive library experience.
- Please leave books to be re-shelved in appropriate designated areas.
- We are not a "shushing" library, but we do try to use our "inside voice."

Each summer the Eldredge Public Library provides a unique, high-quality summer reading program for our community. We have many goals for this program: to celebrate recreational reading; to build upon and reinforce the skills acquired during the school year; to foster a life-long love of books, reading, and libraries; to recognize the vital role the public library plays in communities throughout Massachusetts; and to share the summer days and evenings with you and your family!
